### **Our mission**

To fund vital clinical research into the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of diseases of pets, so that vets always have the knowledge they need to counter the distress and pain caused by those diseases.

#### Who are we?

BSAVA PetSavers is the fundraising and grant awarding arm of the British Small Animal Veterinary Association. We are one of the few charities that promote the study of veterinary medicine to develop the care and treatment that our pets receive without the use of experimental animals.

This is achieved by awarding grants to researchers in veterinary practices and universities. Over the last 50 years, we have invested more than £2 million in vital clinical research and training programmes, including more than £1 million in the last 5 years alone. These studies have contributed to huge breakthroughs in diverse areas, such as kidney disease, anaemia, diabetes, feline leukaemia, deafness, cancer, and heart disease.

Together we can help our companion animals live longer, fuller, and healthier lives.



BSAVA PetSavers funds clinical research that will translate to a tangible benefit to general veterinary practice. In doing so they also provide opportunities and inspiration to the young researchers who may become leaders of their field in the future.

BSAVA PetSavers remains funded solely by charitable donations, receiving none of the BSAVA membership fees.

### How have we helped?

Our grants have made a real difference to the way pet diseases are diagnosed, managed and treated. They also provide a lifeline for clinicians and researchers, as grant funding for pet animal clinical research is notoriously difficult to access. David Bennet received the first BSAVA PetSavers grant in 1975 to study auto-immune joint disease in dogs. The outcome of this provided veterinary practitioners with criteria to accurately diagnose certain joint diseases, leading to more appropriate treatment. We later funded Professor Bennett to research a novel therapy for treating canine osteoarthritis. Recent work funded by BSAVA PetSavers at Hallam Veterinary Centre, Sheffield found key factors that can be used to identify which cats with the most common feline heart condition (preclinical hypertrophic cardiomyopathy) are at risk of developing more serious cardiac disease. This has the potential to benefit the treatment and monitoring of more than a million cats in the UK.

Other recent work includes funding a master's degree at the University of Cambridge that researched canine and feline diabetes mellitus. This work found a decrease in the function of insulin-producing beta cells of the pancreas before their destruction, which could help in the early diagnosis of the disease.

Ongoing work funded by BSAVA PetSavers at the University of Bristol is investigating the potential causes of gastrointestinal upsets in cats within the home environment. The research aims to motivate owners to make changes to ensure their household is more cat-friendly with a view to maintaining both physical and emotional welfare.

### **Create a fundraising page!**

Creating a fundraising page is easy and will allow you to collect donations without any additional stress or worries.

Head to our BSAVA PetSavers Just Giving page https://www.justgiving.com/petsavers and choose to fundraise. Simply select the type of fundraiser you are participating in and follow the option to personalise your page. Then add an image and make it live! The only thing left to do is share it as much as you can.

Once you have completed your activity, the funds raised will automatically be transferred to us with any additional Gift Aid.

### Scan and donate!

Scan and share this QR code to make easy and quick donations directly through our website. You could provide a printed version of the QR code at your fundraising events for a convenient way to collect donations on the spot and claim Gift Aid.

### **Gift aid**

Don't forget if your donators are UK taxpayers, as a registered charity we are able to claim Gift Aid.

At no extra cost to donors, we can receive an added 25% on all funds, giving us an extra £1 for every £4 that's donated! Please ask your supporters to provide their full name, home address and postcode so that we can claim Gift Aid.

### Make some noise

Use as much free advertising as possible to spread the word about your fundraising, especially if you're holding an event! **Social media** can be a good source of advertising. ### Important advice and safety

When planning a fundraising event please make sure you consider the risks and any regulations that you will need to abide by. If you need any assistance, then please get in contact and we can help you with the process.

### **Permission and licenses**

Please ensure you obtain the correct permission from any party involved in your fundraising. This could include property usage or any copyright images you may require. Depending on the event, some areas may require notification or permission requests from the local council.

You may require a license if your event includes any of the following:

- > Alcohol
- Entertainment including recorded music
- > Displaying banners or signs in public areas
- > Holding a raffle, lottery, or auction

It might be easier to hold your event at a place where a licence has already been obtained.

#### Money

We do not authorize door-to-door collections. Where possible, we advise two people to be present when counting money and to use a secure container when collecting cash, such as a lockable cash box. If you are collecting money in a public place, permission from the local council will need to be sought after.

### Safety

Please identify any hazards and evaluate any risks that will need consideration at your event. BSAVA PetSavers cannot accept any responsibility for accidents or emergencies. We strongly advise you to invest in public liability insurance and first aid personnel if you are hosting your own event. You can get advice from a professional first aid provider such as St John Ambulance or the Red Cross about the type of first aid you should have at your event. Please do not attempt anything that cannot be done safely or proceed with any unnecessary risks.

### IMPORTANT

All fundraising must meet the requirements of the law and donor details must be protected.



### **Our branding**

Please remember that when fundraising, you are a representative of us if using our charity name or branding. We ask people to be courteous, polite and expect questions about our work. We ask that you act with integrity and do not mislead donors about our cause or the way the donations will be used. Members of the public should not be pressurised to donate or feel offended or distressed in anyway.
