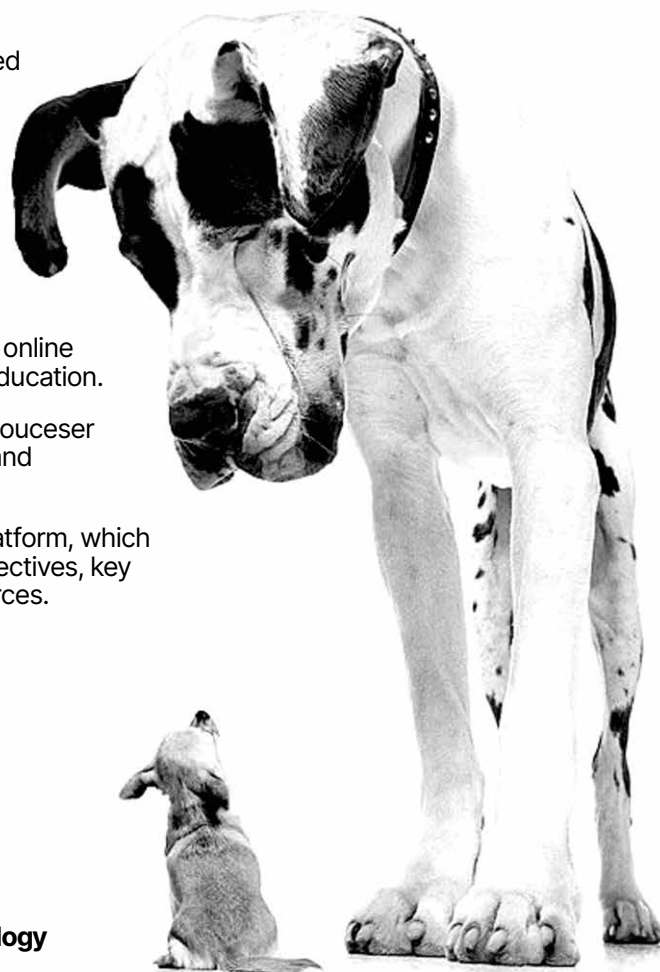

The course structure

Our Small Animal Ophthalmology Postgraduate Certificate is designed for part-time study and delivered through a combination of in-person teaching days and guided, self-paced online activities; giving you the benefits of both in-person and online education.

Practical days are a key part of the programme held between Gloucester and Cambridge, supported by access to up to date equipment and purpose built facilities.

Students will also benefit from the BSAVA education learning platform, which provides a clear overview of the program, including learning objectives, key dates, notes, webinars, discussion forums, and additional resources.



Structure and learning

The course consists of two modules, equating to a total of 200 study hours per year (including self study). We also include a Professional Key Skills course (at no extra cost), which will provide you with the academic requirements needed to gain Advanced Practitioner status from the RCVS.

Module I

- › **Twenty units:** each comprised of:
 - **An in-person day course** including lectures, and interactive case-based discussions and activities,
 - **A period of online study**, featuring webinars and interactive activities, with ongoing support from the subject specialist and a dedicated member of the BSAVA team.
- › **One written examination:** testing the knowledge you have acquired in Module I, prior to progressing to Module II.

Module II

A Casebook is submitted at the end of the third year, this allows you to showcase your ability to work through cases logically, justify your clinical decisions and evaluate outcomes in the context of published literature. Here's what is involved...

- › **Eight case reports** make up the casebook. Designed to be completed by vets working in first opinion practice and don't require specialist equipment.
- › **Two reflective commentaries** focusing on the veterinary skills you have developed.

You will benefit from a dedicated casebook tutor to ensure you have the support you need.

Facilities

Course days are divided between Woodrow House in Gloucestershire, the heart of the BSAVA and conferencing facilities in Cambridge, providing perfect venues for learning and networking.



How to get started?

To enrol in the BSAVA Postgraduate Certificate:

- › Applicants must hold a veterinary qualification
- › UK based applicants must be on the RCVS Home Practising Register
- › Applicants based outside the UK must hold a veterinary qualification that would entitle them to register as members of the RCVS.
- › Applicants must have spent a minimum of one year in Veterinary Practice.
- › Veterinary surgeons who qualified in 2007 or later and who are based in the UK must have completed the RCVS Professional Development Phase (PDP) or Graduate Development Programme (VetGDP) before they can enrol.

As the course is taught and assessed in English, applicants must have a good command of spoken and written English. We do not enforce testing but suggest a minimum British Council IELTS grade requirement of 6.5 or equivalent. Equivalent experience may include the successful completion of a degree or other accredited postgraduate qualification in the English language or a significant period of residence/work placement in an English-speaking country.

Fees overview:

- › **Annual enrolment fee for 2026:** £4,315 + VAT
- › **Total fees:** From £12,945 + VAT
- › Fees are to be paid annually prior to course commencement
- › For the first three years of study, the annual enrolment fee applies. If studies are extended, then only a significantly reduced enrolment is payable in years 4 and 5.
